

Nutrition Society Student Ambassador Job description

As a Nutrition Society Student Ambassador, you will be a student on a nutrition related course. You will be keen and outgoing and will be willing to represent the Nutrition Society to students on your course and other courses with a nutrition science content, within your University. You will also need to liaise with the Nutrition Society University Ambassador (a course leader or director) at your university to ensure a co-ordinated and pro-active approach to students, as well as the Nutrition Society Student Section from time to time.

Role responsibilities

Your role as an Ambassador would include the following within your University:

- ❖ Promoting membership of the Nutrition Society to students who have an interest in nutritional science.
- ❖ Promoting Society activities such as conferences, workshops, webinars, awards, grants and publications. This could include using your internal channels and social media feeds.
- ❖ Supporting the Nutrition Society University Ambassador to ensure a joined-up approach to activities and to ensure Nutrition Society membership and activities information is readily available.
- ❖ To help make a short presentation to students at the start of the academic year with the University Ambassador, to inform new starters about the Society and the benefits of being a member (Nutrition Society staff will provide you with this information/power point presentation)
- ❖ Circulate information sent to you about events and training and other Society activities and news.
- ❖ Act a conduit for queries and feedback from students back to the Society as per the communications pathway.
- ❖ Support and collaborate with the Student Section as appropriate.
- ❖ Provide feedback and ideas, thoughts or comments concerning Society activities and the wider nutrition student population to help with the process of continuous improvement.

Time commitment:

Your time is valuable, and the Nutrition Society is grateful for the few hours a month you may be able to dedicate to helping promote the Society and its aims and events. We would anticipate no more than 3 hours a month at the very most.

We cannot provide financial support, there is no payment for this role, but we will try our best to help in other ways and this role will help expand and improve your skills base and can also be added to your CV as a USP when job hunting, when the time comes.

This role won't guarantee you free attendance at events.

NB: The Society understands that your circumstances may change, and you may no longer be able to spare the time to support the Society's work. The Membership Team would appreciate you notifying us if this becomes the case, and if possible if you could find another student member who may be interested in becoming your successor. One of the Membership Team will contact them and introduce the role to them.
