Introduction

British Journal of Nutrition (BJN) seeks original manuscripts for a Special Issue on “**Nutrition and Cancer**” scheduled to appear in Spring 2019.

There is robust evidence that diet and lifestyle have a substantial impact on the risk of cancer; about one third of the 13 most common cancers in the UK could be prevented through improved diet, physical activity and body weight (World Cancer Research Fund). Moreover, there is accumulating evidence that nutrition influences the wellbeing of cancer survivors.

Objectives and Recommended Topics

This purpose of this special issue is to capture novel research related to nutrition and cancer. The scope of the Special Issue includes (but is not restricted to):-

- Insightful reviews that synthesise the-state-of-the-art and bring new understanding to the topic.
- Epidemiological studies on the impact of nutrition on cancer risk and survivorship.
- Biochemical and molecular studies that provide novel insights into the mechanisms by which nutrients affect cancer in model systems (please note, studies involving medicines or chemical carcinogens are discouraged).

All manuscripts will be peer reviewed and will be expected to meet the usual standards required for publication in the *British Journal of Nutrition*.
