INTERNATIONAL COLLABORATIONS

International Society for Developmental Origins of Health and Disease (DOHAD).

The Society's CEO and Science Director met on 3 October with Professor Lucille Poston, the President of DOHAD, to begin developing a strategic partnership between the two organisations. Potential collaborative topics discussed included joint conferences and a series of webinars.

The Nutrition Society of Australia (NSA).

The Society's CEO and Science Director met on 20 October, during a visit to Melbourne, with the Executive Committee of the Australian Nutrition Society. The meeting discussed a potential MOU to cover mutual projects including publishing, training and joint memberships.

The Society's CEO met on 11 October with the President of the French Nutrition Society to discuss a potential joint publishing venture, and to agree to a joint symposium at the 2023 FENS Conference.

N5.

It was also an opportunity for the group to welcome the new CEOs of IFST and BDA to the N5.

Advisory Council.





Trustee Board.

Under their responsibilities for Risk Management, the Trustees debated areas of external communication required for 2023.
